HILLSDALE, Mich. — Hillsdale College announces the launch of a new podcast, The Imprimis Podcast, which will feature audio versions of printed Imprimis issues. The podcast will be hosted on the college's new integrated Hillsdale College Podcast Network, which features several other podcasts, including The Larry P. Arnn Show, The Radio Free Hillsdale Hour, The Hillsdale Dialogues, and The Hillsdale College K-12 Classical Education Podcast.
